Call to Worship

"Greater love hath no man than this, That a man lay down his life for his friends"

This year saw the hundredth anniversary of the Battle of the Somme, when on the first day of battle alone, 19,240 allied troops were slaughtered as a result of blundering military planning. In every town men answered the Call to Arms, and served together in what were known as "Pals" Battalions.

Brethren from this Lodge joined other Brethren from local Lodges, and found themselves engaged in some of the bloodiest battles of the War.

The First World War was a war without parallel. All previous wars were eclipsed by the scale of destruction.


Hence it was hailed as "The War to end all Wars"!
But only the dead had seen the end of war!!
Twenty one years later saw the outbreak of the Second World War, with even greater loss of life and limb.
And since then the Nation has been involved in even more Conflicts with further loss of life, and broken bodies.

Tonight we meet together to dedicate a fine bronze Memorial Tablet in remembrance of those members of this Lodge who gave their lives for freedom.
